B. A. I Year (SEM-I) - POLITICAL SCIENCE

- To assess the nature of Indian federalism with focus on union-state relations.
- To appreciate the fundamental rights and duties and the directive principle of state policy.
- To analyze the important institutions of the Indian union: the executive: president; prime minister, council of ministers; chief minister and council of ministers; the legislature: Rajya Sabha, Lok Sabha.
- To know the system of the judiciary: Supreme Court and the high courts: composition and powers, judicial review.

B.A. II Year (SEM-IV) – INDIAN POLITICAL SYSTEM

- To analyze the important institutions of the Indian union: Governor, state legislature, chief minister, council of ministers.
- To know the system of the judiciary: High Court: composition and powers and role.
- To critically evaluate the Indian party system – its development and looking at the ideology of dominant national parties.
- To evaluate the role of various forces on Indian politics: Religion; Caste; Gender; Dalit.
- To evaluate the electoral process in India with focus on the election commission: composition, powers
- To know the electoral reforms.

- To trace the evolution of comparative politics as a discipline and drawing a distinction between comparative politics and comparative government.
